
MEDICAID EXPANSION'S POSITIVE IMPACT ON THE NUMBER OF UNINSURED PATIENTS IN NEW HAMPSHIRE



REDUCTION IN UNINSURED SERVICES

Since the implementation of Medicaid Expansion on July 1, 2014, hospitals have seen a vast reduction in the number of uninsured patients seeking care across all service types. Over the past nine years, hospitals have reported a 64% reduction in emergency visits, 54% reduction in inpatient stays, and 49% reduction in outpatient services for uninsured patients.

UNINSURED IN WIDER CONTEXT

Uninsured as a percent of all hospital encounters has decreased significantly since the implementation of Medicaid Expansion. This is most clear in emergency department (ED) visits. For the 12 month period of January-December 2013, uninsured patients made up 19.2% of all ED visits compared to the same 12 month period in 2022 when uninsured patients represented 6.4% of ED visits.
