

## New Hampshire Hospital Association Board of Trustees Resolution on the Treatment of Substance Use Disorder in Emergency Departments Throughout New Hampshire

Whereas substance use disorder is a significant public health burden to the people of New Hampshire, and

Whereas New Hampshire hospitals are often a crucial provider of care for people with substance use disorder, and

Whereas opioid use disorder continues to be a significant contributor to morbidity and mortality for people in New Hampshire, and

Whereas access to medication assisted treatment is the standard of practice as an opioid use disorder intervention that saves lives and provides a pathway to recovery, and

Whereas regulatory and other barriers for providing medication assisted treatment have been significantly reduced,

**Now, be it resolved** by the member hospitals of the New Hampshire Hospital Association that all acute care hospitals will implement the following in emergency departments by December 31, 2024.

- Offer medication assisted treatment to patients identified with an opioid use disorder.
- Offer Narcan upon discharge to patients with an identified opioid use disorder.
- Provide their best effort for facilitated referrals to substance use disorder patients to treatment and recovery services as part of a comprehensive discharge plan.
